MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to St. Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here in Maggie Valley, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week.

DAILY MORNING AND EVENING PRAYER: Daily Morning Prayer is at 7:20 AM and Daily Evening Prayer is at 5:00 PM, according to the *Book of Divine Worship*.

DAILY MASS is celebrated at 8:00 AM. Mass on Saturday morning is taken from the *Book of Divine Worship: The Missal*.

BREAKFAST WITH BECKET will meet on **Wednesday, 3 July, 8:45 am** in the Parish Hall with Exodus 30: *The consecration of the priests*. How does the act of consecration in these scriptures reflect on dedicating things and ourselves to God today? Why do you think the same value was assigned for the rich and poor in the ransom offering? What does the concept of "sanctuary shekel" teach us about sacred space and objects in our contemporary society? How can the preparation of the sacred anointing oil and incense be related to the spiritual preparation we undergo in our lives? How can the principles of sanctification, seen in the making of the altar, basin, and anointing oil, be applied in our current religious practices? How does this passage help us understand the importance of rituals and symbols in our spiritual life and how can we create personal rituals that will enhance our spiritual journey? Come and see the construction of the LEGO® Tabernacle!

AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, July 2** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. **IaIIae q. 18: Good and Evil in Human Action**. In Aquinas' view, some actions are good or bad because of being of a certain kind, as we might say that stealing is a bad kind of action or repaying debts is a good kind. What, however, might be a good or bad kind of action can, he thinks, take its individual shape from how it is performed and by whom and in what circumstances, though he also thinks that the ends we intend when acting are critical when evaluating our actions. So he concludes that an action may be thought to be good in one respect (with respect to being real or good as a kind of action, say) and not good in another (with respect to motive, say) – and

some actions can be morally neutral. Join us on Tuesday and look at this distinction more closely.
